- A. Respond briefly to each of the following questions:
  - 1. **TITLE**: Does the title arouse interest and forecast the question the essay addresses?
  - 2. **INTRODUCTION**: How does the introduction capture your interest and establish a critical question about the sonnet?
  - 3. **THESIS**: Underline the thesis statement. Is the thesis clear and interesting? Does it forecast the essay's structure?
  - 4. **STRUCTURE**: How is the essay structured? Does it have a clear thesis, topic sentences for each body paragraph, good transitions, and so on?
  - 5. **EVIDENCE**: Does the essay use quotations from the sonnet and secondary sources to support its analysis?
  - 6. **QUOTATIONS**: Where could the author improve the effectiveness of signal phrases, quotations, and MLA documentation in the essay?
