  - 3. **STRUCTURE**: How is the essay structured? Does it have a clear thesis, topic sentences for each body paragraph, good transitions, and so on?
  - 4. **SUMMARY**: How would you evaluate the fairness and accuracy of the essay's summary of the original text?
  - 5. **EVIDENCE**: Where does the essay quote from the book? How are each of its points grounded in the text?
  - 6. **QUOTATIONS**: Where could the author improve the effectiveness of signal phrases, quotations, and MLA documentation in the essay?
